You have completed the initial requirements for admission to Washtenaw Community College for the Winter 2022 semester! Please print, read and sign your Form I-20 in the Student Attestation section. **You must arrive in the U.S. no later than January 3, 2022, which is also indicated as the "Program Start Date" on your Form I-20.** Make note your Form I-20 also provides you with the earliest day you will be permitted to enter the U.S. Washtenaw Community College is planning to offer courses for the Winter 2022 semester in the following formats – on-campus, online and virtual classrooms. Per current guidance from the Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP), new/initial students in F1 visa status are not permitted to study in completely online programs and will be required to enroll in some on-campus course offerings.

All WCC F1 visa students are required to attend one of the WCC F1 Orientations and cannot be exempt for any reason. Schedule an appointment by logging into your MyWCC account or by calling (734) 973-3543. These sessions are held before the semester begins on the following dates:

- Friday, December 10, 2021 → 9am until 12:30pm – Zoom meeting
- Tuesday, January 4, 2022 → 12pm – until 3pm - On campus (tentative per COVID protocol at the time)

Reading and writing entry assessment tests, and possibly the ALEKS math test, will be required either before or after you attend the WCC F1 Orientation.

Please submit the following prior to registering for your classes:

1. **Verification of Visa Status** - Please submit copies of your signed Form I-20 and F1 Visa. Also, submit a copy of your electronic I-94, which can be found at the following link: <https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov> after you arrive in the U.S. You will need to submit each of these documents for yourself and any dependents.
2. **Confirmation of Medical Insurance** - WCC provides information on several insurance companies as an option to students. However, students may choose any company that meets our requirements. We will need to see proof for yourself and any dependents that consists of:
 - *A copy of the policy, which includes the **medical evacuation and repatriation clause**.*
 - *The dates of coverage (You must show proof for the entire semester before you will be eligible to register for classes).*

You will be permitted to register for courses only after you attend the WCC F1 Orientation, complete assessment testing, provide verification of your visa status, submit proof of acceptable medical insurance, meet with your academic advisor and complete a request for registration authorization form (this will be discussed at orientation).
